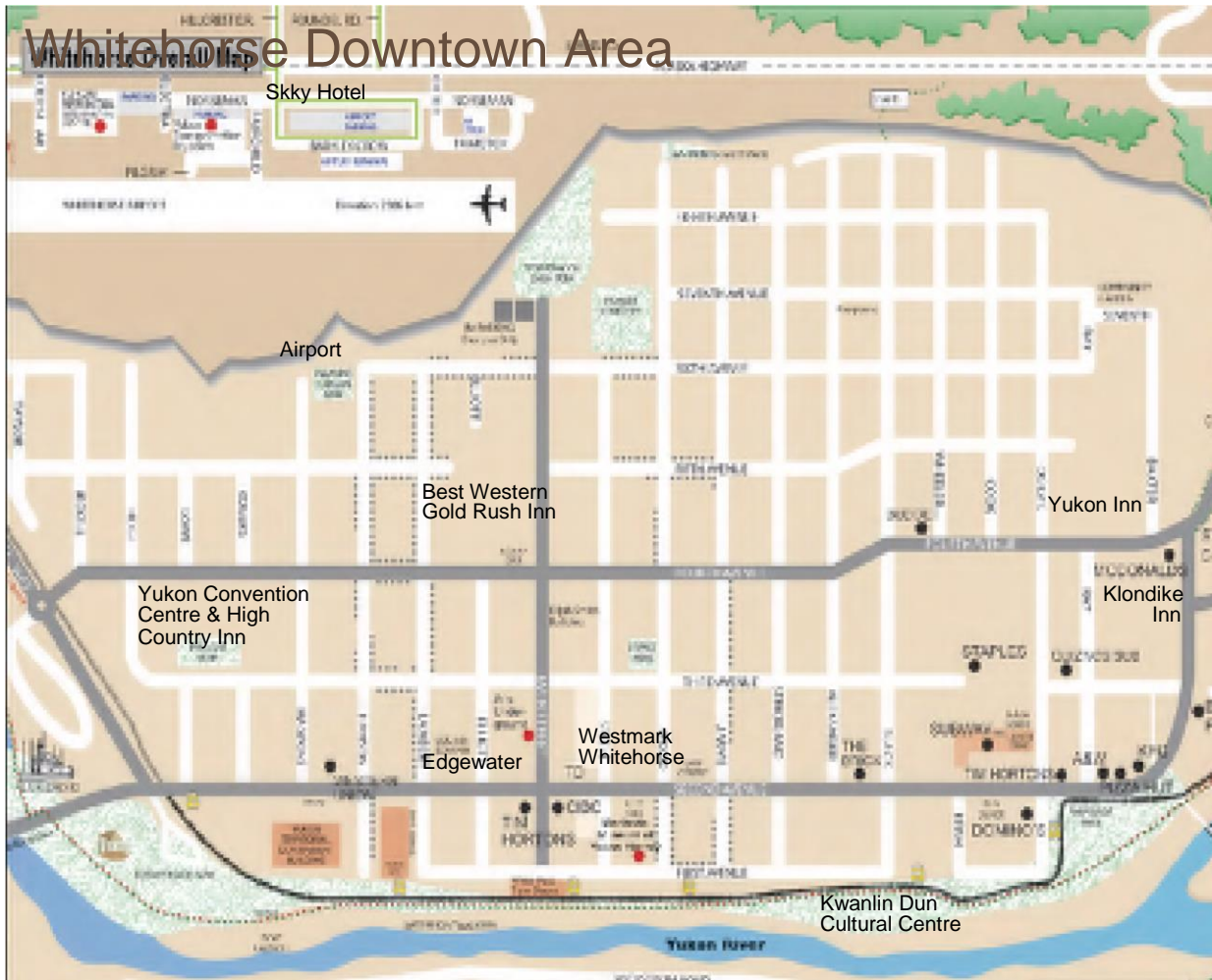

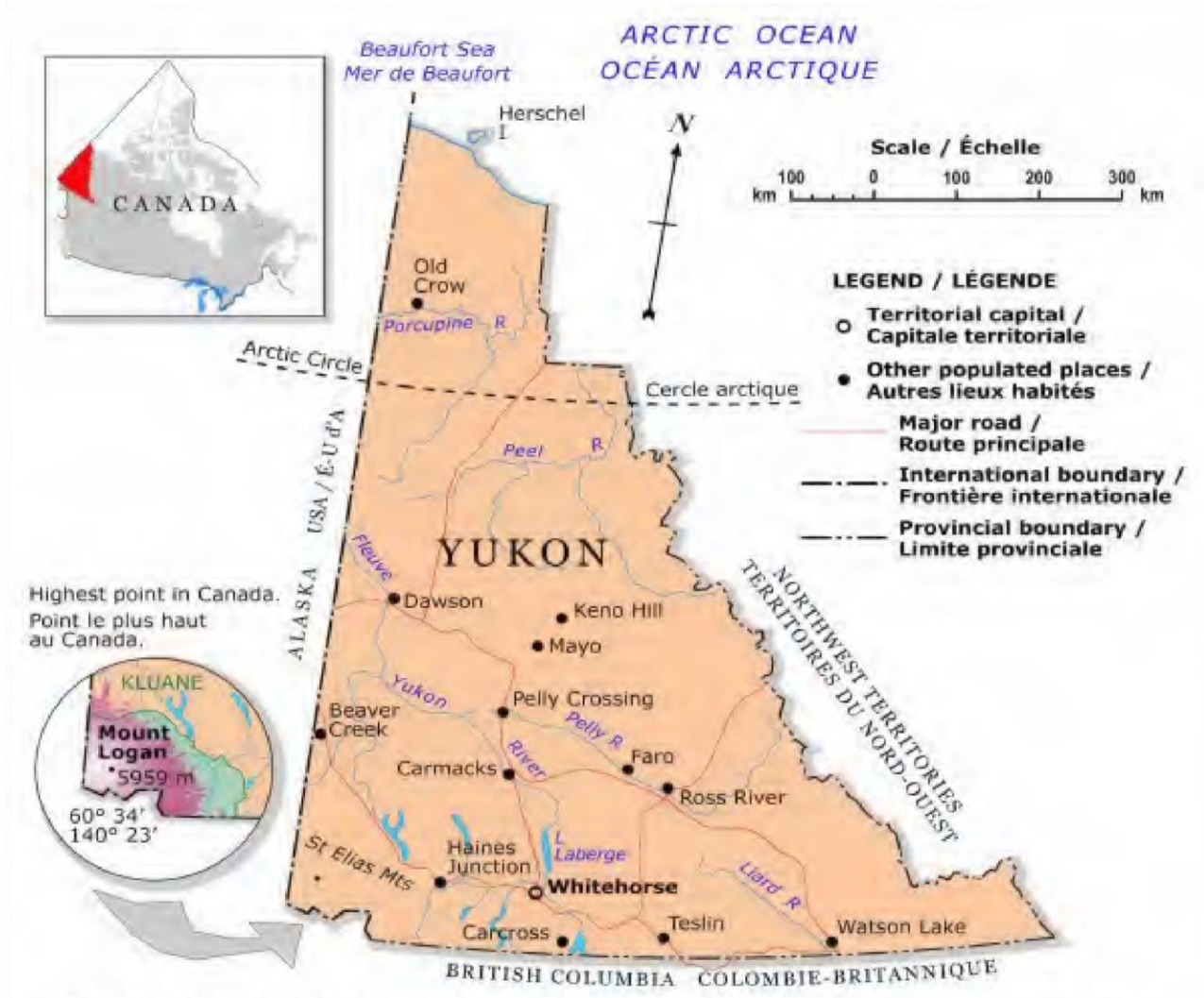
## Bean North Café
