HAIKU WORKSHOP led by Stanford M. Forrester

Stanford M. Forrester is a past president of the Haiku Society of America as well as the editor of *bottle rockets: a collection of short verse*, which boasts its 19th year in print. Stanford has had poems published in many journals and anthologies worldwide. He perhaps is most proud of his haiku being included in *Haiku* edited by Peter Washington in the Everyman's Pocket Poetry Series (Knopf), *Haiku in English: The First Hundred Years* (Norton), and *American Zen: A Gathering of Poets* (Bottomdog Press). In 2004 he took first seat in the 57th Annual Basho Anthology Contest in Ueno, Japan and in 2012, one of his haiku won second place in the International Robert Frost Poetry & Haiku contest.

TANKA WORKSHOP led by Claudia Coutu Radmore

Claudia Coutu Radmore writes lyric and Japanese form poetry and is internationally published in both genres. She has been writing haiku and tanka since the early 90s. *Your Hands Discover Me/ Tes mains me découvrent* (2010, Éditions du tanka francophone, Montreal), is a collection of bilingual tanka. She is proud of being included in Angela Leuck's *More Grows in a Crooked Row*. Her most recent collection of haiku is *the business of isness*, and of tanka is *fish spine picked clean*, (2017 and 2018, Éditions des petits nuages, Ottawa).

HAIBUN WORKSHOP led by Mike Montreuil

Mike Montreil is a writer and translator of Japanese short form poetry. His most recent book of translations, Micheline Beaudry's tanka book *Comme une etoile filante/Like a Shooting Star* was published in 2012 by Bondi Studios.

He was the haibun editor for the on-line journal A Hundred Gourds.

Mike's most recent haibun collection, *The Neighbours are Talking*, was shortlisted for a Haiku Foundation Touchstone Book Award.

international music festival. The young T.S. Eliot wrote one of his early poems inspired by Mount Orford.
